Technical Tests

Scales were fluent and quite even with some shaping heard. Triads were confident; solid had full tone; minor broken slight slip, now aim for rhythmic triplets. Excellent knowledge of technical requirements demonstrated.

Etude

E Dorian with Modulation - Vandall, Robert D.

This performance featured flowing 8th notes with a wonderful sense of line, complemented with warm sonorities and musically designed phrase shapes. Most diminuendos on half note chords were well controlled and effective. Very assured performance.

List A

Air in D Minor, ZT 676 - Purcell, Henry

A very competent performance with technical aspects in place and a musical sense emerging well. Try to pull the motion

over the bar line to feel one main pulse per bar, listening for defined musical contrasts as this progresses. Consider over the par line to leet one main pulse policies, and articulation to help project the dance-like character. A sincere and assured experimenting with bass slur patterns for varied articulation to help project the dance-like character. A sincere and assured approach.

List B

The Sparkling Brook - Goldston, Margaret

A suitable chosen tempo. Try to keep the moving 8ths somewhat lighter to portray the imagery of the water and aim to give shape to the melodic line. Excellent accel. to close and confident approach throughout. This was note perfect and played with fine impetus to the lines to capture the composer's indications.

List C

Jazz Invention No. 2 - Gallant, Pierre

Independence of hands is emerging well. There is room for further expressive shaping of the musical contours, particularly as marked in b.4 to capture the jazz flavour. Rhythmically group the 8ths together for smoothness to help avoid a syllabic approach. Let the direction flow through to the final bar. Very secure rhythmically with the tied and dotted note values all in place. Good work.
